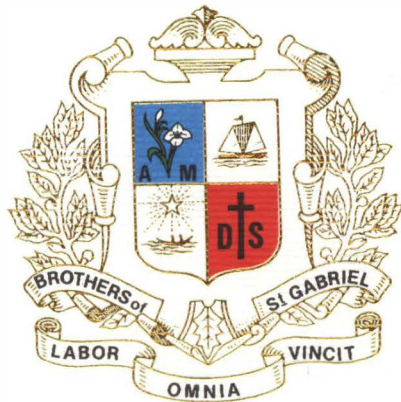

AU AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE

Philosophy and Objectives

“Those who have sacrificed their lives and time by their creative loyalty and positive contributions to the institution must be recognized, promoted and rewarded.” So wrote Rev. Prathip Martin Komolmas in the *Faculty and Staff Development Policies*, July 22, 1993.

The philosophical underpinnings of the AU Academic Awards were simply that good deeds and achievements must be recognized and awarded. The President had often expressed his wish to establish academic awards as incentives for the academic community. Evaluation of job performance for this purpose was undertaken. After a considerable length of time, the administrators decided to introduce the awards. These awards aim to both reward for past performances and encourage future efforts. As a reward, it demonstrates our belief that those selected have met and surpassed the standards of excellence for the award given. The awards are also meant to encourage future efforts of not only the reward recipients but others who may take note that they, too, will be recognized for superior performance. The AU Academic Awards are granted periodically to those who met the selection criteria.

Historical Background

One of philosophies of Assumption University is that good deeds and achievements done by any member must be recognized and awarded. The first conferment of awards was initiated in 1997 under the name **AU Academic Awards**. Only lecturers were nominated for these awards under six categories. Then, three-tier system of achievements (first, second, and third class with the first as the highest in each category) was announced in 1999 to take effect in 2000 (Au Academic Awards, December 24, 1999, p. 12). In the year 2000, the name of the awards was changed to **Au Awards for Excellence**. The purpose is to reward not only teaching staff but also the non-teaching staff who daily facilitate in the management and operation of the institution.

So far the awards committee is chaired by the President with Brothers in the University administration serving on the committee (Au Academic Awards, December 24, 1999, p. 12). The sole right and prerogative on selection of the awardees reside in the committee.

THE SIX AU AWARDS

Each award was named after an illustrious person found in Catholic Church history and also in memory of our predecessors who had worked long and hard to carry out their teaching mission. The general policies governing each award were laid down by the AU Academic Awards Committee in 1997. These policies are subject to review, re-interpretation and modification as may be called for. Except for the St. Montfort Award, the awards are given in three classes. The second and third class awards are meant to recognize mid-level and junior AU faculty and staff who have performed well above the norm as compared to their peer group. The awards are as follows:

St. Montfort Award Illustrious Service Award

The St. Montfort Award was named after St. Louis Marie Grignon de Montfort (1673-1716), the founder of the Brothers of St. Gabriel. He is our spiritual master who walked before us toward the Living God. Following in his footprints, we can proceed on a path to union with God. The Brothers of St. Gabriel in Thailand consider him to be a model for a religious life and for their educative mission.

This award is given for faithful, dedicated and outstanding services rendered to the University by senior administrators whose career spans more than 25 years.

St. Michael Award Public Service Award (First, Second, and Third Class)

The award was named after St. Michael the Archangel, the protector of the people of God.

This award also honors the name of Brother Michael, one of the 13 French Brothers who moved from Thailand to India during World War II. He was appointed master of novices at Eachinkadu, Yercaud, South India, tasked with the training of a number of senior Brothers of the Province of Thailand.

The award comes in three classes and is given to University members who have provided academic and/or other significant services to society, and who have represented the University in academic and supporting activities that are acknowledged by the public. In so doing, they uphold and promote the University's reputation and stature.

St. Hilaire Award
Distinction in Writing Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)

This award was named after St. Hilaire who was born at the beginning of the fourth century at Poitiers in France. He was a bishop and Doctor of the Universal Church.

Brother Hilaire was one of the first five pioneering Brothers to arrive in Thailand in 1901. He was a well-known educator at Assumption College, Bangkok. He mastered the Thai language so well that he became an unparalleled Siamese Linguist. He wrote Thai language manuals; the first of which, *Darun Suksa*, was considered by all as the very best source for the learning of the Thai language.

The award comes in three classes and is designated for those who achieved distinction through academic writings in the form of articles and books.

St. Martin de Tours Award
Excellence in Performance Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)

St. Martin de Tours, for whom St. Martin de Tours Award is named, was a Roman soldier raised in Italy. Finding God, he converted to Christ and became an unwilling soldier. Later he was a disciple of Hilaire of Poitiers and, still later, became the Bishop of Tours.

The award was also named in memory of Brother Martin de Tours, one of the five Brothers who first entered Siam on October 20, 1901.

This award is designated for lecturers and administrators: who discharged their duties and responsibilities conscientiously and superbly: who exhibited high standards of efficiency, excellence and quality in teaching, counseling, and duties such as composition of test materials, framing of examination papers and other academic related factors.

The award is also for non-teaching staff who add to the University learning process.

**St. Bernard Award
Special Merit Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)**

The award was named after St. Bernard (1090-1153), an abbot and later named Doctor of the Church. He was a Cistercian monk. He wrote profusely and movingly concerning the Lord Jesus, spirituality, the Scriptures, and the Blessed Mother.

The award also recognized Brother Bernard Mary whose idea of adding a degree program to the existing Assumption Commercial College (ACC) program that eventually led to the establishment of ABAC and hence Assumption University.

This award is intended for University members: who exhibited special managerial skills; and who performed their tasks and assignments beyond the normal calls of duty such as initiating, restructuring or reengineering of programs for an office or department, or providing voluntary services for improving, upgrading systems and procedures, and participating in other artistic or scientific activities for the welfare of society.

**St. Thomas Aquinas Award
Research Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)**

The award was named after St. Thomas Aquinas in respect for his special talents that he devoted in full measure to the search for the Eternal Truth.

St. Thomas Aquinas was a great Dominican teacher (1225-1274). He traveled and wrote extensively. His two *Summas* should not obscure his other biblical, theological and philosophical writings. He dedicated his brilliant talents to the investigation of the sublime truth of God in the light of faith and the human intellect. He is the patron saint of all Catholic schools.

This award is given to those who contribute through their research to the promotion, enhancement or the reputation and prestige of the University. Their research should result in publications, patents and/or other innovative materials or feature

Report

Rev. Brother President:

It gives me great honor to have your presence at today's AU Awards for Excellence conferral ceremony.

The AU Awards for Excellence is held yearly to recognize good deeds and achievements of outstanding professionals who are committed in one way or the other in enhancing the academic programs, research, student's life, and the Au community at large.

Prior to the awards conferment, I would like to address several issues that mark the success of the University in its ceaseless effort to ameliorate qualifications of the University's faculty and staff members, the University's core competence that would enable her to weather through the increasingly intense competitive environment and retain her leading position in the years to come.

1. The University's Human Resources

To ensure the quality and the sufficiency of her faculty, the University has for the past years put forth her effort in recruiting only well-qualified faculty members with degrees from competitive universities. As part of the University's recruitment process and as a very essential qualification of both full-time and adjunct faculty members, a notable attention has also been given to English proficiency of non-native English speaking faculty members to ascertain their proper use of English both in and outside the class.

Currently, the University has 820 full-time faculty members carrying out various tasks to fulfill the University's four key missions i.e. teaching and learning, conducting research, providing public services, and promoting Thai culture and heritage. Of these 820 faculty members, 142 are Ph.D. holders, while 544 and 134 are master degree and bachelor degree holders respectively. The number of international versus Thai faculty members at present is 53 to 89 (with a ratio of 5.9 is to 4.1) for Doctorate degree holders; 159 to 385 (with a ratio of 4.1 is to 5.9) for master degree holders; and 67 to 67 (with a ratio of 1 is to 1) for bachelor degree holders.

2. Human Resources Development

Currently, more than 115 faculty members and staff are involved in the human resources development program to upgrade their professional qualifications both in Thailand and abroad.

Of 28 faculty members receiving the scholarship to study abroad from the University, 7 are pursuing master's degree while 21 are pursuing a doctoral degree. Furthermore, a total of 81 faculty members, 35 of whom are studying in master's degree, while 20 are in doctoral programs in the state universities, and 23 others, with an aim of strengthening their teaching pedagogy and performance, are studying in a program for Graduate Diploma in Education, have been granted scholarships to enhance their qualifications as well as knowledge in the country.

Having been fully aware of the importance of supporting staff members in rendering good quality services to students and hence their contribution to the attainment of the University's vision, the University has offered scholarships to three staff members to pursue their master's degrees in Thailand, and to one staff member for her doctorate's degree in joint program and outside Thailand.

With her ceaseless effort to meet if not to surpass the 3:6:1 ratio of Doctorate, Master and bachelor degree holders required by Ministry of Education, the University has been implementing a strong and committed human resources development programs, and since last year has strengthen her human resource capital with 18 Doctorate Degree and 25 Master Degree holders.

From academic year 2002 - 2003, 11 faculty and 2 staff members completed their doctorate's degree; and another faculty members completed their master's degree abroad.

During the same time from local state universities in Thailand, 5 faculty members received their doctorates; another 14 their master's of which 10 are faculty members and 4 are staff members. .

As part of the University's scheme to encourage faculty members to get more involved on academic research and article writing, and to expose themselves to the scholastic communities, 4 faculty members have been granted permission to present their papers at international conference in several countries.

In an effort to strengthen her human resources' professional skills as well as competency, the university has also sponsored 264 faculty and 199 staff

members (a total of 463) to attend various seminars and training programs both in Thailand and abroad. It is also noteworthy to report that of those 463 recipients of the university's sponsorship, a total of 34 faculty and 35 staff members have received training programs abroad.

3. International Programs and Initiatives

Of approximately 20,000 enrollments in both graduate and undergraduate programs, 10 percent or 2,100 students are international students representing 57 countries. Some of the countries are China, Myanmar, Vietnam, Taiwan, India, Bangladesh, Korea, Japan and USA. With quality education as well as excellent teaching-learning and accommodation facilities provided, the University also anticipates that foreign student admissions will continue to increase in the future.

4. Research and Article Writings

As part of the scheme in promoting research and article writings, the Office of Vice President for Academic Affairs has published the University's "Research Manual" to facilitate the University's lecturers with desire and determination to seek a career advancement in research writing to have a better understanding about the procedure in writing research and budget proposal.

In addition to the numerous journals published by various faculties in the University; namely ABAC Journal, IJCEM (International Journal of Computer and Engineering Management), Prajna Vihara: The Journal of Philosophy and Religion, The Journal of Risk Management and Insurance, Au Journal of Technology, Au Tech Note, The English Teacher, "The Journal of Management", initiated by the ABAC School of Management, has also recently been added to the University's existing publications.

More importantly, the incessant effort and wholehearted commitment of the university in shifting herself towards "Research University" and in encouraging faculty members to obtain academic titles have brought about fruitful results, as in 2003 academic year, 10 research proposals from the Faculty of Science and Technology were approved and granted fund by the University, and a total of 7 faculty members have been conferred academic titles, 6 of whom have earned Assistant Professorship and 1 Professorship titles.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE AWARDS

1. St. Montfort Award

Dr. Sompit Porsutyaruk

Awarded St. Montfort Award for Illustrious Service

Citation:

Dr. Sompit Porsutyaruk began her teaching career as a dedicated and meticulous lecturer in the Department of English in 1977 after obtaining her Master's degree in English from Chulalongkorn University. In 1991 she secured her Doctoral degree in Curriculum and Instruction from the same university, thereby solidly enhancing her education and training in the field of pedagogy.

During the 1980s and 1990s the university had grown rapidly both in terms of reputation and enrolment and there was need for reorganisation as well as for employment of able, and qualified leaders and Dr. Sompit Porsutyaruk was appointed as Chairperson, Associate Dean and Dean respectively to suit the changing structure of the institution. Alongside her teaching and administrative tasks, Dr. Sompit served on several University committees overseeing arrangements for Royal visits, the academic and curricula development, conferences and seminars. She currently chairs one of the University Internal Audit and Assessment Committees and when the university embarked on its Quality Assurance development program in 1996, Dr. Sompit supported it enthusiastically and prepared her faculty to undergo the first-ever pilot audit by the MUA in November 2003. She has also been a resource speaker at a few seminars on English language teaching and curriculum development in Thailand. In June 2003 Dr. Sompit Porsutyarak was promoted as Deputy Vice Rector for Academic Affairs and Acting Director of Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs. Over the past couple of years she has coordinated four international conferences held under the aegis of the University. In recognition of her teaching service and dedication to Assumption University, she was awarded two Royal decorations, the Most Exalted Order of the White Elephant (5th class) in 1992 and the Most Noble Order of the Crown of Benjaporn Mongkut Thai (6th class) in 1998.

To her students Dr. Sompit is a mentor figure, gentle but firm in her ideals of teaching and fair evaluation. To her colleagues and junior staff, she is a constant source of reaffirmation and confidence building. To Assumption University, she is a versatile administrator-teacher who through her 26 years of

dedicated and loyal service, has helped concretize the teaching and learning legacy of this institution, thus extending the prime educative zeal and example of our founding fathers. The administrators of Assumption University are therefore pleased to confer on her the St. Montfort Award for Illustrious Service on December 24, 2003.

2. St. Hilaire Award

Assistant Professor Brian Charles Lawrence

Awarded St. Hilaire Award for Distinction in Academic Writing (3rd Class)

Citation:

Assistant Professor Brian Charles Lawrence joined Assumption University as Director of the Insurance Research Centre, Faculty of Risk Management and Industrial Service on September 1, 1999 and from June 1, 2003 he was elevated to the position of Dean while retaining the previous post of Research Director. He is also the Editor of the Journal of Risk Management and Insurance. It is observed from the C.V. of Assistant Professor Brian Lawrence that he has held senior executive and academic positions in London, Singapore and now in Thailand and he continues to work with high enthusiasm and dedication for Assumption University as evidenced by the successful publication of the Journal of Risk Management and other articles some of which are listed below.

3. St. Martin de Tours Award

3.1 Mrs. Orawan Arphornsuan

Awarded St. Martin de Tours Award for Excellence in Teaching (3rd Class)

Citation:

The Department of Business Chinese considers Mrs. Orawan Arphornsuan as an exceptionally innovative teacher. It is explained that in the early days when there were no prescribed texts she collected and compiled teaching materials and used them in her classrooms. Her wise selection and adoption of a suitable methodology of dissemination helped students to learn effectively and become articulate and eloquent Chinese speakers.

Mrs. Orawan has worked as a high school teacher for 15 years and another 13 years on our campus has mellowed and matured her to the extent of developing a special personality which enables her to assume the mantle of a revered mentor to students and peers alike. She is always punctual and polite in her dealings and her presence and advice are sought and welcomed by students and colleagues at all times.

3.2 Ms. Nootrudee Siriboon

Awarded St. Martin de Tours Award for Excellence in Teaching (3rd Class)

Citation:

Ms. Nootrudee Siriboon joined the Faculty of Biotechnology on June 1, 1994 as a full-time lecturer but within a short space of time and on October 1, 1995 she was promoted as Chairperson of the Food Technology Department. She was found to be highly capable, proficient and resourceful and her expertise was also attributable to the fact that she has worked as Assistant Dean, Student Affairs and Chairperson of Department of Food Technology in Rangsit University for over 3 years during 1991-1994.

Ms. Nootrudee holds a Master's degree in Food Science from Kasetsart University and her research interests are in Cereal, Bakery, Fruit and Vegetable Technology as well as in Quality Control, Sanitation and Packaging and she taught mostly in these subjects. She is a highly disciplined and no-nonsense type of lecturer and knowing this her students concentrate on their studies and derive benefit by absorbing and assimilating their lessons quickly and without distractions. Ms. Nootrudee Siriboon has worked here smoothly and effectively for nearly ten years and in appreciation of her services and contributions she is awarded the St. Martin de Tours Award for Excellence in Teaching (3rd Class) with effect from December 24, 2003.

4. St. Bernard Award

4.1 Ms. Norranuch Paikaew

Awarded St. Bernard Award for Special Merit (2nd Class)

Citation:

Miss Norranuch Paikaew joined the University as acting chief accountant in 1983. In 1984 and based on her satisfactory performance, she was promoted to Director of the Finance Department. Through her knowledge, dynamism and ingenuity, she has developed a system that is the envy of many other institutions who regularly send their officers to study our system of maintaining and preparation of accounts. The financial reports presented by the University have been hailed by the Ministry of University Affairs as superb and fit to serve as a model for others. Eager to improve herself, she is constantly looking for ways and means to learn more in order to perform better by attending lectures or seminars in her field of expertise.

Whenever she is called for extra-duty, whether to arrange meetings, receptions of dignitaries or important celebrations or share her experience and knowledge, she will contribute generously to the best of her ability whether it means long hours of work at night or whole week-ends far from home. She has helped all the schools of the St. Gabriel Foundation develop sound financial systems and goes on giving them support and advice whenever it is necessary.

In sum, Miss Norranuch Paikaew has surpassed all the requirements expected of her as the Director of the Finance Department of Assumption University and is hereby awarded the St. Bernard Award for Special Merit (2nd Class) on December 24, 2003.

4.2 Mrs. Yupawadee Laoledchai

Awarded St. Bernard Award for Special Merit (3rd Class)

Citation:

Mrs. Yupawadee Laoledchai graduated from Assumption University in 1987 taking the Business Computer major. She then pursued and obtained the M.Com (Business Information Systems) degree from University of Woollongong, Australia in 1990. During the years she had acquired considerable experience and expertise by working as Systems Analyst, Consultant, etc. both in Australia and Thailand and she was therefore given the position of Director, ABAC Integrated Information Systems Centre on her reappointment on October 1, 1997.

Mrs. Yupawadee Laoledchai is reputed to possess a high degree of personal competency combined with a very pleasant personality and these qualities bring out wonderful results when working on computer systems with teams of colleagues and assistants. She is credited with having developed the following systems:

3. Administrative System
4. Payroll System
5. Directory Service Implementation
6. Information Provisioning System, or Automatic User Account Management
7. Interdepartmental Processes and Data Integration

The successful development of these systems has enabled Assumption University to accelerate automation of operational procedures and work schedules as well as keeping abreast of new technologies to maintain a high level of executive thrust and management efficiency. Prof. Dr. Tin Win was in the employ of the University of Yangon, Myanmar and he retired on April 6, 1992 while working in the position of Professor/Head of Chemistry Department.
