AU AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE

Philosophy and Objectives

"Those who have sacrificed their lives and time by their creative loyalty and positive contributions to the institution must be recognized, promoted and rewarded." So wrote Rev. Prathip Martin Komolmas in the *Faculty and Staff Development* Policies, July 22, 1993.

The philosophical underpinnings of the AU Academic Awards were simply that good deeds and achievements must be recognized and awarded. The President had often expressed his wish to establish academic awards as incentives for the academic community. Evaluation of job performance for this purpose was undertaken. After a considerable length of time, the administrators decided to introduce the awards. These awards aim to both reward for past performances and encourage future efforts. As a reward, it demonstrates our belief that those selected have met and surpassed the standards of excellence for the award given. The awards are also meant to encourage future efforts of not only the reward recipients but others who may take note that they, too, will be recognized for superior performance. The AU Academic Awards are granted periodically to those who met the selection criteria.

Historical Background

One of philosophies of Assumption University is that good deeds and achievements done by any member must be recognized and awarded. The first conferment of awards was initiated in 1997 under the name AU Academic Awards. Only lecturers were nominated for these awards under six categories. Then, three-tier system of achievements (first, second, and third class with the first as the highest in each category) was announced in 1999 to take effect in 2000 (Au Academic Awards, December 24, 1999, p. 12). In the year 2000, the name of the awards was changed to Au Awards for Excellence. The purpose is to reward not only teaching staff but also the non-teaching staff who daily facilitate in the management and operation of the institution.

So far the awards committee is chaired by the President with Brothers in the University administration serving on the committee (Au Academic Awards, December 24, 1999, p. 12). The sole right and prerogative on selection of the awardees reside in the committee.

THE SIX AU AWARDS

Each award was named after an illustrious person found in Catholic Church history and also in memory of our predecessors who had worked long and hard to carry out their teaching mission. The general policies governing each award were laid down by the AU Academic Awards Committee in 1997. These policies are subject to review, re-interpretation and modification as may be called for. Except for the St. Montfort Award, the awards are given in three classes. The second and third class awards are meant to recognize mid-level and junior AU faculty and staff who have performed well above the norm as compared to their peer group. The awards are as follows:

St. Montfort Award Illustrious Service Award

The St. Montfort Award was named after St. Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort (1673-1716), the founder of the Brothers of St. Gabriel. He is our spiritual master who walked before us toward the Living God. Following in his footprints, we can proceed on a path to union with God. The Brothers of St. Gabriel in Thailand consider him to be a model for a religious life and for their educative mission.

This award is given for faithful, dedicated and outstanding services rendered to the University by senior administrators whose career spans more than 25 years.

St. Michael Award
Public Service Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)

The award was named after St. Michael the Archangel, the protector of the people of God.

This award also honors the name of Brother Michael, one of the 13 French Brothers who moved from Thailand to India during World War II He was appointed master of novices at Eachinkadu, Yercaud, South India, tasked with the training of a number of senior Brothers of the Province of Thailand.

The award comes in three classes and is given to University members who have provided academic and/or other significant services to society, and who have represented the University in academic and supporting activities that are acknowledged by the public. In so doing, they uphold and promote the University's reputation and stature.

St. Hilaire Award Distinction in Writing Award (First, Second, and Third Class)

This award was named after St. Hilaire who was born at the beginning of the fourth century at Poitiers in France. He was a bishop and Doctor of the Universal Church.

Brother Hilaire was one of the first five pioneering Brothers to arrive in Thailand in 1901. He was a well-known educator at Assumption College, Bangkok. He mastered the Thai language so well that he became an unparalleled Siamese Linguist. He wrote Thai language manuals, the first of which. Darun Suksa, was considered by all as the very best source for the learning of the Thai language.

The award comes in three classes and is designated for those who achieved distinction through academic writings in the form of articles and books.

St. Martin de Tours Award Excellence in Performance Award (First, Second, and Third Class)

St. Martin de Tours, for whom St. Martin de Tours Award is named, was a Roman soldier raised in Italy. Finding God, he converted to Christ and became an unwilling soldier. Later he was a disciple of Hilaire of Poitiers and, still later, became the Bishop of Tours. The award was also named in memory of Brother Martin de Tours, one of the five Brothers who first entered Siam on October 20, 1901.

This award is designated for lecturers and administrators: who discharged their duties and responsibilities conscientiously and superbly: who exhibited high standards of efficiency, excellence and quality in teaching, counseling, and duties such as composition of test materials, framing of examination papers and other academic related factors.

The award is also for non-teaching staff who add to the University learning process.

St. Bernard Award Special Merit Award (First, Second, and Third Class)

The award was named after St. Bernard (1090-1153), an abbot and later named Doctor of the Church. He was a Cistercian monk. He wrote profusely and movingly concerning the Lord Jesus, spirituality, the Scriptures, and the Blessed Mother.

The award also recognized Brother Bernard Mary whose idea of adding a degree program to the existing Assumption Commercial College (ACC) program that eventually led to the establishment of ABAC and hence Assumption University.

This award is intended for University members: who exhibited special managerial skills; and who performed their tasks and assignments beyond the normal calls of duty such as initiating, restructuring or reengineering of programs for an office or department, or providing voluntary services for improving, upgrading systems and procedures, and participating in other artistic or scientific activities for the welfare of society.

St. Thomas Aquinas Award Research Award (First, Second, and Third Class)

The award was named after St. Thomas Aquinas in respect for his special talents that he devoted in full measure to the search for the Eternal Truth.

St. Thomas Aquinas was a great Dominican teacher (1225-1274). He traveled and wrote extensively. His two *Summas* should not obscure his other biblical, theological and philosophical writings. He dedicated his brilliant talents to the investigation of the sublime truth of God in the light of faith and the human intellect. He is the patron saint of all Catholic schools. This award is given to those who contribute through their research to the promotion, enhancement or the reputation and prestige of the University. Their research should result in publications, patents and/or other innovative materials or feature.

Citation

Rev. Brother Simeon Anupatt Petchara-Yuttachai

Citation for Rev. Brother Simeon Anupatt Petchara-Yuttachai as Professor of the Order of St. Gabriel at Assumption University of Thailand

In the winter of 1939, responding to a call from God, the nine-year old Claude Petiteau wrote down his commitment to join the Montfortian Brothers of St. Gabriel and to travel overseas to teach in any of their schools. Following his scholastic, juniorate and novitiate years in France, as a young Gabrielite, Rev. Brother Simeon began his teaching career on October 7, 1950 in France. In 1953 with some experience as a teacher, he moved to London where he taught for three years.

Rev. Brother Simeon, at the request of his superiors, arrived in Thailand on January 3, 1957 to begin his mission as a teacher in various primary and secondary schools of the Gabrielite Brothers. He also founded a few institutions at secondary level. Intermittently Rev. Brother Simeon was educated in the Philippines (1969-1972 and 1987-1989) and in the USA at Santa Clara University, California (1976-1977) respectively. Even while he attended degree programs as a student, Rev. Brother Simeon lectured in Finance courses in the Philippines and at California.

Rev. Brother Simeon's first assignment to the newly established Assumption Business Administration College was in 1972, where he arrived to teach Accounting and Marketing. In the subsequent years of his teaching at ABAC, Rev. Brother Simeon taught courses in General Management. In 1978 following his return from the USA, Rev. Brother Simeon was appointed as the first-ever Chairperson of the newly created Department of Finance and Banking. Between the years 1979 and 1987, Rev. Brother Simeon served as Vice President for Academic Affairs at ABAC, concurrently teaching courses with Finance specialization ranging from Corporate Finance to Financial Management. In 1994 Rev. Brother Simeon was appointed to his current positions as Vice President for Financial Affairs and Senior Lecturer in the Department of Finance and Banking, and continues in these roles even to the present time.

Rev. Brother Simeon is a consummate and dedicated teacher. Through the many years of his encountering the youth of the world and here in Thailand, he has exuded self-discipline in preparing his lectures, his innovative assignments, projects and training for the students, and as his Thai first name, Anupatt, implies, he is and has been a mentor and advisor to many generations of students. Rev. Brother Simeon's punctuality to class, and the fact that in his 58 years of teaching, he has cancelled fewer than 10 classes, is testament to his self discipline and to his total value as a teacher to his students. Quite a good number of Rev. Brother Simeon's students have been admitted to top universities the world over for further studies.

Rev. Brother Simeon represents the ideal example of a transformative teacher in his philosophy, which I quote from his own words: "The way I regard my duty as lecturer is to look at what I have to do, and that is, to change the student as 'raw material' into a 'beautiful finished

product.' In teaching I do not just consider the material, but also the deportment of my students. I believe that when students graduate, they should be fit and better formed as educated individuals." To the purpose of melding in his students academic qualifications and personal ethics, Rev. Brother Simeon has for over a good many years held his own "Last Orientation" for graduating students in the very last class session, every semester. Graduates acclaim the advice given by Rev. Brother Simeon as enriching and extremely valuable to them in their lives beyond university.

It is indeed appropriate for us to therefore conclude that Rev. Brother Simeon's role as a transforming teacher is to lead by setting personal higher dispositional and knowledge acquisition examples.

More significant however, is the fact that Rev. Brother Simeon has kept faithful to his religious vows by balancing his teaching and administrative careers with two golden religious practices. The first of these is prayer. Rev. Brother Simeon spends at least two hours everyday in prayer and in contemplation. The second practice is to wear the Crucifix of Christ on the lapel of his shirt or coat. "I point out to my students, that the cross symbolizes my belief in someone, someone who never fails me. I therefore love the one, Jesus who never fails me." The internalization of Christ-centered values, and the externalization of religious credo, to Rev. Brother Simeon, is representative of the personal background and education that he has received. Furthermore, "it also means asking, what shall we do with our lives? Our actions in life will be guaranteed of success, for success is not a destiny, it is a way of living. It also means being fulfilled in what I have done. Looking back, my life has a meaning."

It is only fitting at a time like this for Assumption University of Thailand to genuinely appreciate and honor the life and the work of a dedicated and committed Gabrielite, serving the cause of education and forming the lives of young learners, spanning three continents and accruing to over 58 years. Assumption University of Thailand is pleased to induct Rev. Brother Simeon Anupatt Petchara-Yuttachai as Professor of the Order of St. Gabriel. on the auspicious date of December 24, 2008.

AU Awards for Excellence

1. St. Bernard Award for Special Merit

Asst. Prof. Dr. Warayuth Sriwarakuel Awarded St. Bernard Award for Special Merit (First Class)

Citation:

Dr. Warayuth Sriwarakuel has served Assumption University since June 1, 1992. He became the dean of the Graduate School of Philosophy and Religion on May 1, 1999. He was appointed Assistant Professor in October 1999. Before serving Assumption University, Dean Warayuth, holding an MA in philosophy from Chulalongkorn University (with GPA 3.92 and very good thesis), worked with the Consortium (under the auspices of the U.S. Department of State) and Save the Children (under the auspices of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees) at Phanat Nikhom Indo-Chinese Refugees Holding Center as a teacher and a coordinator respectively for 7 years. After joining Assumption University, he upgraded his qualifications by obtaining a Doctorate in philosophy from Chulalongkorn University in 1996 and a post-doctoral certificate from the Catholic University of America in 2000.

Dr. Warayuth has dedicated himself to serving Assumption University for nearly 17 years. As an instructor, he has always recognized that a good teacher must play at least four roles, namely, a researcher, a communicator, an evaluator, and a good role model. As a researcher, he has written and published more than 40 academic papers in various journals and texts, both in Thailand and abroad, in the name of Assumption University. He wrote two books and edited two books. As a communicator, he has always simplified his explanation and discussion in philosophy for his students in simple English. As an evaluator, he is straightforward, just and kind to his students. As a role model, he has behaved himself in a humble manner in the same way as Socrates did. He usually works from early morning to late evening every day except Friday. He believes in the motto that deeds are louder than words. He has always tried to inspire his students with his competency, character, and care.

As an administrator, he has run his school through participative democratic management style. Teamwork is a practice in the Graduate School of Philosophy and Religion. He believes that a dean is like a coach of a football team who knows his people, loves his people, and encourages them to actualize their given potentials to the fullest for the sake of students, the university, and the society at large. He and his team have revised and updated four curricula, namely MA and Ph.D. in philosophy and MA and Ph.D. in religious studies, twice under his leadership since 1999. So far the Graduate School of Philosophy and Religion has already produced 21 doctors and 53 MA graduates who are serving in various sectors in Thailand and abroad.

As the editor-in-chief of Prajñā Vihāra he encourages his team to issue the journal of philosophy and religion every six months. He and his team are well aware that it is one of their missions to promote justice, peace and mutual understanding among the peoples of the world. The journal is designed to be the stage for scholars from the country and all over the world to make their contributions in philosophy and religion. As academicians, Dr. Warayuth and his colleagues have provided academic services to the public in different kinds of activities. His

school has organized more than ten national/international conferences. He gives special lectures, teaches philosophical subjects, and serves as a thesis/dissertation examiner at different universities and educational institutes in the country. He is a member of the editorial board of the Humanities Journal of Kasetsat University. He is also a member of the editorial board of the Journal of the Philosophy and Religion Society of Thailand. He is an external peer reviewer for these journals. He is a member of the Internal Quality Assurance Committee of Saengtham College. He is an assessor of the Internal Quality Assurance for the CHE and of the External Quality Assurance for the ONESQA.

Dr. Warayuth is selected the President of the Philosophy and Religion Society of Thailand (http://www.parst.or.th), the President of the Southeast Asian Philosophical Association (SEAPA), the former President of the Asian Association of Catholic Philosophers (http://www.asian-philosophers.com), the Regional Coordinator of the Council for Research in Values and Philosophy (http://www.crvp.org). Recently, he has been nominated and selected as a committee director (CD) of the International Federation of Philosophical Societies (FISP) at the XXII World Congress of Philosophy organized at Seoul National University, Korea (http://www.fisp.org). This is the first time that Southeast Asia has two representatives (one from Vietnam) in this highest non-governmental world organization for philosophy which was established in Paris in 1948.

Due to his outstanding services and dedication, Assumption University is pleased to award Dr. Warayuth Sriwarakuel the St. Bernard Award for Special Merit (First Class) on the auspicious date of December 24, 2008.

Awarded St. Bernard Award for Special Merit (Third Class)

Citation:

Mr. Kanjanasit Chinnapha earned his B.A. (Business English) from Assumption University in 1994 and M.S. in International Hotel Management from the University of Buckingham, UK in 1998. Currently, he is a Ph.D. candidate at the Southern Cross University, Australia. He has been the Chairperson of the Department of Hospitality and Tourism Management, School of Management since June, 2006.

Mr. Kanjanasit Chinnapha teaches Kitchen Operation and Food and Beverage Service. He has provided his students vast and practical experiences in hotel management and related activities; hence, he has received positive feedback from both students and colleagues.

The following are some of his notable contributions and special assignments:

- 2008: Appointed as a committee member by the Commission on Higher Education to establish the Center of Excellence in Hospitality and Tourism sector.
- 2007: Integrated in-house training for students and Kitchen Operation and Food Service classes by initiating the construction of a new kitchen facility at the Suvarnabhumi campus. The project is aimed at enhancing the teaching and learning of culinary art and food services. The new kitchen facility is at par with other leading hotel schools and can bring recognition to the university both locally and internationally.

- 2006: Revised the Hospitality and Tourism curriculum to meet the demand of the tourism industry and to meet the requirements set by the Tourism Authority of Thailand. Students who take this course benefit not only from the course itself but also will receive a "Tour-Guide" certificate upon completion of the program.
- 2006-present: Has been appointed committee member of numerous university's activities on a national as well as an international level.
- 2000: Established a 100-hour in-house training program for students to gain first-hand experience in their hospitality courses. This helps students develop their service skills and prepare students for their future career. This program has been offered for ten years now and is considered a success. This also has brought recognition to the Department and the School of Management.

For his dedication to work and services rendered to the University, Assumption University is pleased to award Mr. Kanjanasit Chinnapha the St. Bernard Award for Special Merit (Third Class) on the auspicious date of December 24, 2008.
