




AU AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE

Philosophy and Objectives

“Those who have sacrificed their lives and time by their creative loyalty and positive contributions to the institution must be recognized, promoted and rewarded.” So wrote Rev. Prathip Martin Komolmas in the *Faculty and Staff Development Policies*, July 22, 1993. The philosophical underpinnings of the AU Academic Awards were simply that good deeds and achievements must be recognized and awarded. The President had often expressed his wish to establish academic awards as incentives for the academic community. Evaluation of job performance for this purpose was undertaken. After a considerable length of time, the administrators decided to introduce the awards. These awards aim to both reward faculty members for past performances and encourage future efforts. As a reward, it demonstrates our belief that those selected have met and surpassed the standards of excellence for the award given. The awards are also meant to encourage future efforts of not only the reward recipients but others who may take note that they, too, will be recognized for superior performance. The AU Academic Awards are granted periodically to those who met the selection criteria.

Historical Background

One of the philosophies of Assumption University is that good deeds and achievements done by any member must be recognized and awarded. The first conferment of awards was initiated in 1997 under the name AU Academic Awards. Only lecturers were nominated for these awards under six categories. Then, three-tier system of achievements (first, second, and third class with the first as the highest in each category) was announced in 1999 to take effect in 2000 (AU Academic Awards, December 24, 1999, p. 12). In the year 2000, the name of the awards was changed to **AU Awards for Excellence**. The purpose is to reward not only teaching staff but also the non-teaching staff who daily facilitate in the management and operation of the institution.

AU Awards for Excellence

Each award was named after an illustrious person found in Catholic Church history and also in memory of our predecessors who had worked long and hard to carry out their teaching mission. The general policies governing each award were laid down by the AU Academic Awards Committee in 1997. These policies are subject to review, re-interpretation and modification as may be called for. Except for the St. Montfort Award, St. De La Salle Award and St. Joseph Award, the awards are given in three classes. The second and third class awards are meant to recognize mid-level and junior AU faculty members and staff who have performed well above the norm as compared to their peer group. The awards are as follows:

St. Montfort Award
Illustrious Service Award

The St. Montfort Award was named after St. Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort (1673-1716), the founder of the Brothers of St. Gabriel. He is our spiritual master who walked before us toward the Living God. Following in his footprints, we can proceed on a path to union with God. The Brothers of St. Gabriel in Thailand consider him to be a model for a religious life and for their educative mission.

This award is given for faithful, dedicated and outstanding services rendered to the University by senior administrators whose career spans more than twenty-five years.

St. Michael Award
Public Service Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)

The St. Michael Award was named after St. Michael the Archangel, the protector of the people of God.

The award also honors the name of Brother Michael, one of the 13 French Brothers who moved from Thailand to India during World War II. He was appointed master of novices at Eachinkadu, Yercaud, South India, tasked with the training of a number of senior Brothers of the Province of Thailand.

This award comes in three classes and is given to University members who have provided academic and/or other significant services to society, and who have represented the University in academic and supporting activities that are acknowledged by the public. In so doing, they uphold and promote the University's reputation and stature.

St. Hilaire Award
Distinction in Writing Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)

The St. Hilaire Award was named after St. Hilaire who was born at the beginning of the fourth century at Poitiers in France. He was a bishop and Doctor of the Universal Church.

Brother Hilaire was one of the first five pioneering Brothers to arrive in Thailand in 1901. He was a well-known educator at Assumption College, Bangkok. He mastered the Thai language so well that he became an unparalleled Siamese Linguist. He wrote Thai language manuals, the first of which, Darun Suksa, was considered by all as the very best source for the learning of the Thai language.

This award comes in three classes and is designated for those who achieved distinction through academic writings in the form of articles and books.

**St. Martin de Tours Award
Excellence in Performance Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)**

St. Martin de Tours, for whom St. Martin de Tours Award is named, was a Roman soldier raised in Italy. Finding God, he converted to Christianity and became an unwilling soldier. Later he was a disciple of Hilaire of Poitiers and, still later, became the Bishop of Tours. The award was also named in memory of Brother Martin de Tours, one of the five Brothers who first entered Siam on October 20, 1901.

This award is designated for lecturers and administrators: who discharged their duties and responsibilities conscientiously and superbly: who exhibited high standards of efficiency, excellence and quality in teaching, counseling, and duties such as composition of test materials, framing of examination papers and other academic related factors. The award is also for non-teaching staff who add to the University learning process.

**St. Bernard Award
Special Merit Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)**

The St. Bernard Award was named after St. Bernard (1090-1153), an abbot and later named Doctor of the Church. He was a Cistercian monk. He wrote profusely and movingly concerning the Lord Jesus, spirituality, the Scriptures, and the Blessed Mother.

The award also recognized Brother Bernard Mary whose idea of adding a degree program to the existing Assumption Commercial College (ACC) program that eventually led to the establishment of ABAC and hence Assumption University.

This award is intended for University members who exhibited special managerial skills, and who performed their tasks and assignments beyond the normal calls of duty such as initiating, restructuring or reengineering of programs for an office or department, or providing voluntary services for improving, upgrading systems and procedures, and participating in other artistic or scientific activities for the welfare of society.

**St. Thomas Aquinas Award
Research Award
(First, Second, and Third Class)**

The St. Thomas Aquinas Award was named after St. Thomas Aquinas in respect for his special talents that he devoted in full measure to the search for the Eternal Truth. St. Thomas Aquinas was a great Dominican teacher (1225-1274). He traveled and wrote extensively. His two *Summas* should not obscure his other biblical, theological and philosophical writings. He dedicated his brilliant talents to the investigation of the

sublime truth of God in the light of faith and the human intellect. He is the patron saint of all Catholic schools.

This award is given to those who contribute through their research to the promotion, enhancement or the reputation and prestige of the University. Their research should result in publications, patents and/or other innovative materials or feature.

**St. De La Salle Award
Commendable Service Award**

The St. De La Salle Award is named in honor of St. De La Salle, a learned man and Patron Saint of all teachers, who is credited with writing the pedagogy of the teaching profession and the twelve virtues of teachers.

This award recognizes and rewards faculty members who have served exclusively as lecturers for over twenty-five years at Assumption University, maintaining high standards of excellence in their profession.

**St. Joseph Award
Dedicated Service Award**

The St. Joseph Award is named after St. Joseph. The bible mentions him as a humble and just man. The Catholic Church has proclaimed Saint Joseph as the Patron Saint of all workers.

This award recognizes and rewards full-time staff members who, having served at Assumption University for at least twenty-five years, in their everyday work and roles, go beyond themselves in bringing service with satisfaction to their colleagues and students, in selfless ways.

Research Fellow

The title “Research Fellow” is conferred upon a distinguished Professor or Lecturer before he retires from active service at the university.

Individuals appointed to this honorary position display a deep love for research as a pathway to truth. Their endeavors in revealing inspirational truths through research are indeed commendable and worthy of recognition.

This recognition also includes individuals who have contributed, through their intellectual works, to the strengthening of the university’s expertise either through writing textbooks, creating a faculty or setting intellectual standard for academic connoisseurs.

It is an honour that the President graces the conferral ceremony for AU Awards for Excellence 2015. Prior to the awards conferral, I would like to present you the historical background, philosophy and objectives of the AU Awards for Excellence and the significance of the awards for Assumption University's community.

The AU Awards for Excellence was officially initiated on 22 July 1993 by Rev. Bro. Prathip Martin Komolmas. He initiated the policy which he wrote: "Those who have sacrificed their lives and time by their creative loyalty and positive contributions to the institution must be recognized, promoted and rewarded."

The first conferral of awards was initiated in 1997 under the name **AU Academic Awards** under six categories. Then, three-tier system of achievements: first, second, and third class, with the first as the highest in each category was announced in 1999 to take effect in 2000. In the year 2000, the name of the awards was changed to **AU Awards for Excellence**. In 2008, the President of Assumption University decreed the inception of the **Professor of the Order of St. Gabriel** as part of the annual award ceremony to honour faculty members who are dedicated to teaching and providing service through other avenues within the university.

Since its conception, Assumption University has always deemed it appropriate to acknowledge the contributions of everyone within the university community, especially individuals who have contributed immensely to the success and attainment of academic goals of the university. Acknowledgement of such sacrifice, commitment and dedication to teaching, research, administration and service is a graceful act. Individuals who have shown such dedication and hard work are worthy of recognition and award.

The philosophical underpinnings of the AU Awards for Excellence are simply that good deeds and achievements must be recognized and awarded. These awards aim to both reward faculty members for past performances and encourage future efforts. As a reward, it demonstrates our belief that those selected have met and surpassed the standards of excellence for the award given. The awards are also meant to encourage future efforts of not only the award recipients but others who may take note that they, too, will be recognized for excellent performance.

In 2009, Rev. Bro. Prathip Martin Komolmas, President Emeritus, initiated two additional distinguished awards namely, St. De La Salle Award and St. Joseph Award which would be conferred to faculty members and staff members who have made valuable contributions to the university and have been committed and dedicated to their profession, roles and responsibilities for over twenty five years.

For the year 2015's AU Awards for Excellence, the University takes great pleasure in conferring

1. St. Montfort Award for Illustrious Service to one faculty member,
2. St. Michael Award for Public Service to two faculty members,
3. St. Hilaire Award for Distinction in Writing to one faculty member,
4. St. Martin de Tours Award for Excellence in Performance to three faculty members,
5. St. Bernard Award for Special Merit to one faculty member,
6. St. Thomas Aquinas Award for Research to two faculty members,
7. St. De La Salle Award for Commendable Service to seventeen faculty members,
8. St. Joseph Award for Dedicated Service to thirteen staff members.

St. Montfort Award for Illustrious Service

Assistant Professor Dr. Nanthaphan Chinlumprasert

Awarded St. Montfort Award for Illustrious Service

Citation

Assistant Professor Dr. Nanthaphan Chinlumprasert is the present Dean of the Bernadette de Lourdes School of Nursing Science. She received her Ph.D. degree in Nursing Research from the University of Illinois in Chicago, USA in 2000. She joined Assumption University in 1990 as a full-time lecturer in the Faculty of Nursing Science and gradually climbs up the academic ladder from being the Associate Dean from 1993 to 2002 to being the Dean in 2003 to the present.

Faithful, dedicated and outstanding in rendering services to the University, Assistant Professor Dr. Nanthaphan's career spans more than twenty-five years, bringing into the Bernadette de Lourdes School of Nursing Science a filial touch of leadership, almost as gentle but decisive and as service minded as Florence Nightingale. Among many of her achievements as a Dean is her leading her Faculty to obtain the maximum 4-year accreditation of the nursing program granted by the Thailand Nursing and Midwifery Council (TNMC), four times consecutively from 2002 to 2017. Her hard work and commitment to education and the nursing profession have made the Bernadette de Lourdes School of Nursing Science one of the leading nursing faculties in Thailand offering international nursing programs.

As an energetic Dean, Assistant Professor Dr. Nanthaphan has spearheaded several student development activities. She believes in developing students as individuals evidenced by the scholarly activities she has organized and initiated to train and expose students to international activities such as the ASEAN Institutes of Health for Development of Primary Health Care in which AU nursing students have won the selection every year since 2003, the International Council of Nurses (ICN) Quadrennial Congress in which AU nursing students were awarded by the Nurses' Association of Thailand to be representatives of Thailand to participate in the ICN Student Assembly held in Taiwan in 2005, in South Africa in 2009 and in Australia in 2013. This year, an AU nursing student has been awarded by the Nurses' Association of Thailand to be the representative to the ICN Conference in South Korea.

Assistant Professor Dr. Nanthaphan is actively involved not only in her School's activities but also in Assumption University's University quality assurance activities, especially Internal Quality Assurance (IQA) and External Quality Assurance (EQA) activities in which she has immensely contributed since 2002. Currently, she is a member of the Assumption University Quality Assurance Executive Committee.

Assistant Professor Dr. Nanthaphan has an impressive record of academic services as follows: Internal Quality Assurance Auditor for Office of Higher Education Commission from 2002 to the present, External Auditor for the Office for National Educational Standards and Quality Assessment (ONESQA) from 2002 to 2010. As the Chairperson of International Affairs Committee and member of the Board of Directors of the Nurses' Association of Thailand, she has been involved in many international health care policies. She was appointed as the Thai delegate to participate in the World Health Assembly (WHA) at the United Nations, Geneva, Switzerland in 2012, 2014 and 2015. She is a committee member of the National Research Council of Thailand (NRCT) for the sociology research section, from 2012 to 2015. She serves as a member of various committees such as the Thailand Nursing and Midwifery Council: Nursing State Board License Examination Committee from 2000 to the present, Nursing Educational Institution Accreditation Committee from 2013 to the present and National Nursing Education Committee from 2014 to the present. Academically, she is a member of the graduate thesis examination, Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University, from 2004 to the present.

In Assistant Professor Dr. Nanthaphan's Awards-roster, the following are noteworthy: Virginia M. Ohlson International Scholarship Award for Academic and Dedication to the Advancement of Nursing from the Global Leadership Office of University of Illinois at Chicago in 2000, Prestigious Award for Outstanding Public Health Nurse in Education Management from the Thai Public Health Nurses Association in 2014, and Prestigious Award for Outstanding Leadership in Professional Development from the Nurses' Association of Thailand in 2015.

For her 25-year record of consistent excellence and dedication to teaching and leading the Bernadette de Lourdes of Nursing Science, Assumption University is pleased to award Assistant Professor Dr. Nanthaphan Chinlumprasert, the Dean of the Bernadette de Lourdes School of Nursing Science, the St. Montfort Award for Illustrious Service on this auspicious date of December 24, 2015.

Assistant Professor Dr. Linchong Chorrojprasert

Awarded St. Michael Award for Public Service (Third Class)

Citation

Assistant Professor Dr. Linchong Chorrojprasert graduated with honors from Chulalongkorn University with a Bachelor's Degree in Arts and she earned two degrees from Pittsburg State University in the US- an M.A. in American Literature and a Specialist's Degree in Higher Education and Community College. She went on to complete the Advanced Certificate in Educational Sciences from KU Leuven in Belgium and obtained her Ph.D. in Education from the University of Wollongong in Australia.

She joined Assumption University as a fulltime lecturer in 1989 and has since made significant contributions in different academic and administrative roles in various schools and units. She has served as the Dean of the Faculty of Arts and later the Dean of the Institute for English Language Education since 2006. At present, she is concurrently serving as the Acting Dean of the Graduate School of English.

Assistant Professor Dr. Linchong has made substantial contributions to the quality advancement of the English curriculum of Assumption University over the last two decades in terms of in-house publication of textbooks, assessment standards, curriculum design and faculty development. In addition, she has played a crucial role in assisting the University with its student recruitment programs, both in Thailand and overseas. Through her numerous public services provided to educational and professional organizations and institutions, both local and international, she has elevated the public image and brought wider recognition for Assumption University, particularly in English language education.

From the early years of her teaching career, Assistant Professor Dr. Linchong has been one of the finest examples of a true professional in higher education. Her professional and academic contributions are well recognized and much appreciated by many reputable institutions and organizations.

Since 2007, she has served as the key speaker for a series of academic workshops organized by the Office of Civil Service Commission for the Thai government scholarship recipients. The workshops aim to provide the officials and scholarship recipients with the language competency required to successfully enroll in their overseas degree programs and the academic skills necessary for them to effectively pursue their academic goals.

For almost a decade now, she has served as the Visiting Principal Professor for the Faculty of Education, University of Wollongong, a guest lecturer for the Graduate and Ph.D. programs at the Language Institute of Thammasart University and the Faculty of Liberal Arts, Mahidol University. Furthermore, she serves as the editorial board member for the academic and institutional journals for Assumption University, Thammasart University and Mahidol University and is actively involved in the organization of various international and inter-institution conferences in English language education.

Over the past years, Assistant Professor Dr. Linchong has played an instrumental role in the English curriculum development of the schools under the supervision of the Foundation of the Brothers of Saint Gabriel. Her leadership and support of the curriculum and textbook revision projects, and professional development programs for teachers and administrators for all these schools have won much acclaim and honors for her team and Assumption University.

In appreciation for her appreciable contributions and devotion in enhancing the prestige of Assumption University through her public services, Assumption University is pleased to confer the St. Michael Award for Public Service (Third Class) to Assistant Professor Dr. Linchong Chorrojprasert on this auspicious date of December 24, 2015.

Awarded St. Michael Award for Public Service (Third Class)

Citation

Assistant-Professor Dr. Thitipong Tanprasert is a full-time faculty member of the Department of Computer Science, Vincent Mary School of Science and Technology. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering from Chulalongkorn University, and Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy in Computer Engineering from University of Louisiana at Lafayette, USA. He became a full-time faculty member of Assumption University in 1994, and has served as the Chairperson of the Department of Computer Science twice. In the past two decades, he has been involved in a number of public services which have brought recognition to Assumption University, particularly those where he served as appointed committee by the government. Some of these selected services are as follows:

- Member of the committee judging the final round of The National Software Contest, 1999-2014. The National Software Contest is the biggest and the most prestigious national-level computing project contest of Thailand for university and school students, hosted by The National Electronic and Computer Technology Center (NECTEC), Ministry of Science and Technology. There

were 648 projects funded in 2015. The winner of each category received the royal trophy from HRH Princess Sirinthorn.

- Project advisor of a Thailand representative in Computer Science category to participate in The Intel International Science and Engineering Fair 2014 (Intel ISEF 2014), titled “A Heart-Rate-Controlled Animated Exercise Trainer Using Neural-Network-Based Adaptive Control”, Los Angeles, USA, 2014, appointed by The National Electronic and Computer Technology Center (NECTEC), Ministry of Science and Technology. The Intel ISEF is the largest school-level science and engineering project competition in the world. There are approximately 1,700 finalists representing approximately 75 countries each year.
- Member of the organizing committee of the 23rd International Olympiad in Informatics hosted by Thailand in 2011, appointed by the Ministry of Science and Technology, 2009 – 2011.
- Member of the subcommittee recruiting members of Thailand Computer Olympic team, appointed by the Institute for the Promotion of Teaching Science and Technology (IPST), Ministry of Science and Technology, 2002 – present.
- Steering committee member and reviewer of the International Conference on Knowledge and Smart Technology (KST), since 2013.
- Program committee member and reviewer of the 4th International Conference on Current and Future Trends of Information and Communication Technologies in Healthcare (ICTH), 2014, Halifax, Canada.
- Doctoral degree dissertation advisor of Piyabute Fuangkhone, a doctoral graduate of Assumption University in 2013. The dissertation was awarded “Outstanding Ph.D. Dissertation Award” from the Association of Private Higher Education Institution of Thailand.
- Member of the committee judging the final round of Thailand STEM Education Teacher Awards 2014, High school technology category, appointed by The Institute for The Promotion of Teaching Science and Technology (IPST), Ministry of Education.

Associate Professor Dr. Sushama Kasbekar received her B.A. at Nagpur University, India in 1975. Her second Bachelor's degree in Journalism and Mass Communication was also earned from Nagpur University in 1976. Her Master's degree in English Literature was conferred in 1978 and Ph.D. in 1993 from Indore University, India. She stood first in the university for her Bachelor of Journalism and Mass Communication and for her Master's degree in English Literature. She was awarded the Austen Wingate Prize for Journalism in 1976.

Associate Professor Dr. Sushama Kasbekar joined Assumption University in 2000 as full-time lecturer at Business English Department, Faculty of Arts. Since then she has devoted herself to teaching, research and extensive writing for education in her field. She has served her Faculty in various ways contributing actively to its growth. She has contributed to the intellectual development of her students.

Associate Professor Dr. Sushama has written textbooks, research papers and academic articles on a variety of topics related to journalism and mass communication and English language and literature.
