**Examining University Students' Language Awareness of** 

**Metalinguistic Knowledge in the Thai Context** 

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Abstract:

This study aimed to investigate Thai university students' language awareness of metalinguistic

knowledge of English, which focuses on learners' ability to detect and give explanation for

errors in English. A verbal protocol of learner introspection was used with 15 participants

studying in the Business English Major in a Thai university. The specific investigation was on

errors with verbs which encompass those of tense, aspect, and verb complementation. It was

found that most participants identified mistakes inaccurately and in particular they seemed to

have serious difficulties with verb complementation. Also, it was found that the participants

referred to grammar rules they learned in high school rather than to what they have been

exposed to in their university courses to explain grammatical structure. Insights gained from the

verbal protocols are useful to help students to understand the thought processes involved in

metalinguistic reflection, promote language awareness and address students' conceptual

confusion with English rules.
